



Course Etiquette

- **Pace of Play** - Please maintain pace of play less than 4hrs 20min
 - Pace Setters (first hour of tee times) expected to play in under 4hrs.
 - Baylands has established a “Time Par” of 4 hours and 20 minutes as a reasonable amount of time to complete an 18-hole round (2:10 for nine holes). All golfers should be able to accomplish this if you follow these tips:
 - Chose a set of tees commensurate with your ability not your ego.
 - Recommended Tees to play corresponding to your driver distance
 - Black 270+ yards
 - Blue 240-270 yards
 - White 200-240 yards
 - Green under 200 yards
 - Play ready golf, don’t worry about honors. When you are at your ball and ready to play, do so. Don’t worry about who in your foursome is away or has honors. Take no more than 30 seconds to hit each shot.
 - Stroke Limit. For a casual round of golf, pick up and move to the next hole once you have reached double par (i.e. 6 strokes on a par 3).
 - Be Cart Smart. Drop your partner off and drive to your ball. Take the club you think you’ll need plus one more and one less. Park behind the green which is on the way to the next hole.
 - Limit your search for lost balls. USGA Rules allow NO MORE THAN 3 minutes to look for a lost ball. If ball is lost, use USGA Local Rule E-5 and drop on edge of fairway adjacent to where you think the ball ended up, two-stroke penalty.
 - Keep moving. Despite the saying, golf should NOT be a leisurely walk in the park. Proceed quickly to your ball and be ready to play. While others are putting, prepare for your putt. Move quickly to the next tee.
 - Keep pace with the group ahead of you. Know your position in relationship with the group ahead of you and stay within one shot of them.
- Environmental Sensitive Areas (ESA) - Marked with red stakes with green tips. Entry is prohibited - Please do not enter or play from these areas. Entry/play out of these areas will result in removal from the golf course.
- Carts:
 - Follow cart signs by each putting green
 - No carts allowed on greens, tee boxes, native areas, or ESA areas.
 - Keep carts on paths for all Par 3's



- Wet conditions - Please avoid driving on low/wet/muddy areas.
- Sand Divots
- Repair your own ball mark and one other.
